## CHILD SAFEGUARDING SCORECARD

As a child rights organisation, we'll do whatever it takes to keep children safe, on track and connected to community and culture. Every child must be protected by the same rigorous approach regardless of what part of Save the Children they encounter. **Enabling children and young people to understand, identify and raise their safety concerns with a trusted adult and within safe organisations is vital.** The Child Safeguarding Scorecard tracks how each Pacific Country Office is performing against the below targets, training percentages and number of staff code of conduct breaches involving a child from **July to December, 2020.**
